## LIMB AND BRUSH PICKUP PROGRAM

For the convenience of the residents of Grand Prairie, the city operates a Limb and Brush Pickup Program. This once a month service provides curbside pickup of limbs and brush that are not eligible for collection by the city's weekly garbage collection.

This is a year round program that services areas of the city on a monthly rotation basis. This is done during a designated week each month, according to geographical zones, rotating from north to south, week by week.

#### **Placement and Pickup**

Brush must be placed at the curb no earlier than 1 week before the scheduled pickup in your area. You must have the brush on the curb no later than 7 a.m. on the Monday of your designated week.

On Mondays the designated zone will be inspected to locate residents who require brush pick up. The brush crew will then be in that zone for the entire designated week to make pickups at those locations. Brush is picked up in cycle only; no appointments accepted. (See Brush Pickup Schedule and Map to determine your zone and designated week.)

### Standard Large Brush Pickup Fees

- Residents receive 1 FREE BRUSH PICKUP EACH MONTH to a maximum of 5 cubic yards.
- There is a charge of \$85 for each additional 5 cubic yards of brush.
- Special pickup requests that are NOT in your designated week will be charged \$85 for each 5 cubic yards.

If a resident has an oversized brush pile; a notice will be placed on the front door giving the cost for the special pickup. The resident is then given 24 hours in which to sign the notice and contact the city at 972-237-8525 to schedule the special pickup and authorize the city to add the extra charge to the resident's water bill. If you do not respond to the notice within 24 hours, the resident will have a 3 day period to remove the brush pile from the curb, or be subject to city code violations.

#### **Important Facts to Know**

- Brush must be neatly piled at least 2 feet from utility poles, trees, gas & water meters, fire hydrants, fences, mailboxes, sprinkler heads, and any other obstacle that would prevent collection.
- Brush will not be picked up if parked vehicles or other obstructions are
- Brush cannot at any time obstruct any city sidewalk, right-of-way, or view of oncoming traffic.
- Residents can be fined if brush is left at the curbside for an extended amount of time.
- The maximum size allowed for the FREE brush pickup is 5 cubic yards. This measures approximately 8'x 6' x 5' tall (about the size of a small
- Brush includes tree limbs, shrubs, tree trunks, other parts of shrubs and trees up to 20" inch diameter.
- Grass clippings, leaves, stumps, root balls, weeds, flowers, wire, fencing, plastic bags, or other foreign materials are NOT allowed. In order for your regular weekly garbage, Republic Services, to pick up your brush, it must be bundled into maximum 6-foot lengths, no larger than 1 cubic yard. Bagged leaves and shrubs will be collected, but NO grass clippings are allowed. Bundles and bags cannot exceed 50 lbs. each. Maximum number of bags that will be collected is 2-3. Place the bundles next to your household garbage.

# KEEP TRASH OUT OF **N**EIGHBORHOODS

Please set out garbage and recycling by 7 a.m. on your scheduled collection day.




but no earlier than 8 p.m. before your collection day. Animals tend to find garbage bags that are set out too early causing trash to be strewn all over the street and vards. In addition, trash bags and cans that are set out too early can smell and clutter the street. # HOUSEHOLD HAZ **WASTE COLLECTION**

Make sure excess pool chemical containers are in good condition, and incompatible chemicals are stored separately. A safer alternative is to bring them to a household hazardous waste collection event for proper disposal. The next events will be held Saturday, Oct. 3 and Saturday, Nov. 7, 9-11 a.m. at the Development Center, 206 W. Church (next to City Hall). Registration is required. We will accept household and automotive batteries, motor oil, cooking oil, paint, aerosol cans, fluorescent bulbs, and household, landscape, and pool chemicals. We will not accept explosives, gas cylinders, fireworks, medical waste, pharmaceuticals, radioactive materials, or municipal trash. No commercial waste will be accepted.





## FREE ELECTRONICS RECYCLING


The City of Grand Prairie Solid Waste and Recycling Division is hosting a free electronics recycling event on **Saturday**, **Nov. 7, 9-11 a.m. at the Development Center parking lot, 206 W. Church St.** Nov. 15 is America Recycles Day. To celebrate, the city will host another free electronics recycling event on **Saturday**, **Nov. 14, 9 a.m.-noon, at the UA cinema parking lot, 510 Westchester Pkwy.** 

Items accepted are computers, laptops, printers, VCRs, DVD players and TVs. Items that cannot be accepted are any hazardous material, liquids, broken monitor tubes, yard equipment, air conditioners and refrigerators. No registration is required and the event is open to Grand Prairie residents and small businesses. Proof of residence in the form of a water bill or driver's license is required.

Grand Prairie residents (not businesses) can also bring their unwanted electronics to the landfill located at 1102 MacArthur Blvd for free during business hours. For more information on recycling electronics please visit gptx. org/recycling.

TexAnna TADDpole promotes the following safety rules:

- Monitor the weather.
- Get to higher ground when flooding occurs.
- Avoid areas that are already flooded.
- Do not drive on roads or bridges that are under water.
- Do not camp or park your vehicle along streams.
- Be especially cautious at night when flood dangers are harder to see

As a reminder, the City of Grand Prairie participates in the Community Rating System (CRS) which allows its residents and businesses to purchase flood insurance at a discounted rate. Flood insurance is a separate policy from renters or home owners insurance and is only available from the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) through local insurance agents that have agreed to carry this policy. Renters can purchase flood insurance to cover potential damages to their belongings (contents only). Property owners can purchase flood insurance for just the structure or for the structure and its contents. Flood insurance is based on the location of the structure, and insurance agents that provide this policy are not allowed to markup the cost of flood insurance. So, no need to shop around for a better rate! # Put a Collar on Pet Cats

It's not uncommon to see cats and kittens roaming neighborhood streets, but it can be difficult to



determine whether or not the animals live nearby, are stray or are feral. Feral cats, while beneficial, are undomesticated and survive on their own. Owned cats and strays are used to being around people. Oftentimes, owned cats are allowed to roam the yards around their homes. In order to keep residents and other pets safe, however, the city of Grand Prairie's Code of Ordinance establishes specific guidelines by which cat owners must abide.

Under city ordinance Section 5-18, all cats owned by Grand Prairie residents – even outdoor cats – must at all times wear an identification tag containing the name, address and telephone number of the owner. Further, under Section 5-8, all owned cats within the city must be vaccinated against rabies, and they are required to wear a metal tag that serves as proof of rabies vaccination. Not only do these identification tags make it easier to locate and contact the owners of lost pets, they contain information that can be valuable to Animal Services officers. Grand Prairie Animal Services always recommends that pet owners microchip their pets as a form of secondary identification, and it provides microchipping services for \$10 per animal.

To help control the feline population in the city and ensure the health of the animals, Section 5-12 dictates that all owned cats that are allowed to roam outside must be sterilized. It is unlawful for an unaltered, domesticated cat to run at large within Grand Prairie limits.
